For Area Middle School & High School Students

SCHOOL DIRECTIONS & EVENT INFORMATION

Location

The Racine County Fairgrounds is located at 19805 Durand Ave (State Hwy 11), Union Grove, WI 53182. The event takes place in the Activity Building and the open area to the west and north. [directions]

Bus Parking

Buses should enter at Gate #7 from US Hwy
45 and proceed to the open area on the right
to park. Everyone is to remain on the bus

until Build My Future SE WI safety volunteers release students, staff and school volunteers. All buses will also exit out Gate 7 (see map).

Homeschool and Non-Bus parking

Personal vehicles transporting homeschool students or smaller groups not on a bus should enter at Gate #7 and proceed to the gravel area just past bus parking on the right. Participants should proceed to the Sheep Sales Arena and wait for Build My Future SE WI safety volunteers to release students, parents and volunteers (see map).

Safety Briefing


Upon arrival, *ALL* students will receive a safety briefing *BEFORE* exiting the bus or sales arena and entering the activity area.

T-Shirts/Safety Glasses/Bags

After being released from the Safety Briefing, students will proceed to the designated area to pick up t-shirts, safety glasses and drawstring backpacks. Each student receives one of each. Students are asked to wear their t-shirt and safety glasses the entire time they are on the grounds.

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

Middle Schools

Students attending on Wednesday are to be in groups of 10 with a single adult chaperone. At no time will any students be unchaperoned. One adult chaperone is required for up to and not exceeding 10 students. Each group will be assigned a Tour Guide for the event.

High Schools

Students attending on Thursday are able to freely move around the event, safely exploring their interests.

There are both indoor and outdoor interactive exhibits. A separate map will be provided that outlines where each exhibit is located. On the second page of the map, will be a list of what activity each exhibitor offers.

Announcements will be made when middle schools should move back to the buses and when high school students should move to the debrief area at the end of the time slot.

Bathrooms



School participants should use the rest room available near bus parking and t-shirt pick up.

Weather- Rain or Shine



Everyone is of course hoping for good weather. Light rain will *not* stop the event. Everyone should dress accordingly.

However, if it can be determined in advance that weather will become a challenge, event staff will communicate with participants via the email provided at registration about next steps.


Dress appropriately for *outdoor* October weather and construction activities.
